# Using Infusible Ink Markers with Your Cricut

Many of us feel fear and overwhelm when it comes to making something new. I am no different. Infusible ink has been on my radar for a long period of time and I always had an excuse why I was not able to work on an infusible ink project. I finally purchased some t-shirts that had a high polyester count so I could test out my new project.

The first thing was to make a design I could “draw” with the Cricut! You can find the template in my [resource library](#) - look for asset #334. I must say this was a lot of fun and I am definitely going to be making more infusible ink projects.

## Materials Used in this Post

- ✓ [Cricut Maker or Air 2 with Standard or Light Grip Mat](#)
- ✓ Laser copy paper
- ✓ Infusible Ink Pens
- ✓ EasyPress
- ✓ EasyPress Mat
- ✓ Cardstock or Butcher Paper to act as a bleed barrier
- ✓ Template from my [Resource library](#) (asset #334)

# Step-by-Step Guide

## Step One - Template



Start a new project then download the file from the resource library, unzip it, then upload the SVG file to Cricut Design Space.

Once uploaded, click on the image then click on the Insert Image button to add it to your canvas

## Step Two - Making changes in Design Space



Start by ungrouping everything, then grouping each flower with all its petals together. This way you will not lose pieces!

Arrange your flowers in any manner you wish. The image here shows the patterns I decided to use.

Select the flowers one at a time and change the Operation to Pen, then select a color - these will be the colors you will likely use to draw the flower. Do this for each flower.

When you have made all the color adjustments, select the entire project and click on Attach. This way your flowers will stay in the design shape you made.

You should also double check your layers panel to make sure all the flower pieces are set to pen. Often a stray piece may still be set to cut and you will need to change it to pen.



### Step Three - Drawing the Project

Since you will be using your Infusible Ink markers, you will need to choose laser copy paper for your material.

Have your infusible ink markers ready and switch them out as prompted



### Step Four - Ironing-On the Design

Time to get out your EasyPress and set it up by using the Cricut Heat Guide for your material. Each type of material will have a different setting. Here is the link to the heat guide: [https://cricut.com/en\\_us/heatguide](https://cricut.com/en_us/heatguide)

### Step Five - Ironing

For ironing, you want to be using a heat pad on the bottom, a piece of cardstock or butcher paper on top of the pad and then insert these into the t-shirt centering them as best as possible.

Flatten the front of the shirt and use a lint brush to remove any extra fibers.

Finally, lay the printed portion of the laser copy paper down on the shirt, place another piece of paper on top to absorb any bleeding.

Apply the easypress as directed.

### Step Six - The finishing touches

Wait until your project has cooled before removing the laser paper from the shirt. Once everything has cooled down, remove the butcher paper or cardstock and the heat pad then admire your work!
