Imagine making a few of these to hang in your kitchen and you can even add a banner across the kitchen window to really make Valentine's Day special (our Valentine's Day Banner - asset #308) and also making this easy Valentine's Day Banner at the same time. You can even add your own sayings!

All the materials can be items you already have on hand. You will also find the template already to go in my [resource library](#) (asset #309)

- ✓ [Cricut Maker or Explore with Standard Grip Mat](#)
- ✓ Iron-on vinyl - 2 or 3 patterns or colors for maximum effect
- ✓ EasyPress or iron
- ✓ Weeding Tools
- ✓ Template from my resource library - Asset #309


Valentine's Day Tea Towel Step-by-Step Guide



Step One - Download the Template

To start you will want to download the template (asset #309) from my [resource library](#).

Unzip the file and upload the SVG files only to Cricut Design Space



Step Two - Design Space Changes

In Design Space you will want to adjust the sizing to fit your tea towel.

Go to the templates in Design Space and find a template that closely resembles your tea towel and select it.

This will give you a template on your Canvas to act as a guide when sizing your project.

Please note: Templates do not cut or print with your project, they act as a guide only.

After you click on Make it, make sure you mirror your design, especially if you used words. This is something that is easy to forget to do. So please, double-check your work.

Now go ahead and cut your design.



Step Three - Ironing on the Design

Look up the heat guide for your type of vinyl and your surface. For example, you could look up Terry Towel and Patterned Iron-on to get the right temperature and time for ironing-on your design.

If you have layers, iron on one layer at a time but make sure you protect the underneath layer so it does not bleed through or get stuck on your iron.



Step Four - The Finishing Touches

Wait for your design to cool if you used a cool peel and then take off the protective layer.

If it is a warm-peel, you will still need to let the design cool a bit.

If your design will not peel properly, wait a little bit longer to see if it peels. If you are still having issues, press it on again.
