What am I working on for the remainder of this month?


I have pushed myself into using my Cricut Maker more and more. I started this week with taking my logo into Design Space and making a print then cut file for using iron-on transfer paper. I actually tried a couple of methods before settling in on one that will really work. Now you do not need a Cricut or Easy Press to use iron-n transfers, you can simply print out your design on an ink jet printer, then cut the shape with your scissors, and finally iron-on the transfer to your piece of clothing.



The one thing you must have is a very hot iron - NO STEAM! Generally, you should follow the directions on the package for how long to keep the iron on the transfer.

But, let me tell you a little secret, use parchment paper over the top of the image (after you have removed the backing) so the iron will not stick to your design. I actually created a video on how to do this which I will release next week.

As an add on to this project, I decided to add an iron-on design to a tennis visor. This was a little more difficult as the hat is curved. I had to stuff the visor before applying the decal and putting heat to the surface. A learning curve for sure.
