

This week's Blog Article - Cricut Craft - How to Make a FULL Sheet of Stickers

I have a friend who just purchased a Cricut Maker and was having difficulty making a full sheet of stickers. Cricut has a print and cut option that was not working for her. The size was restricted to much less than a full page.

This blog article explains how you can get around those restrictions and get the full 8.5 by 11 page of stickers printed and cut as they should be. It is much easier than a few of the videos I watched. I simplified the steps so you will not be frustrated with the amount of work it could take. My method works extremely well, but I want to caution you...you will have to make a couple of adjustments to make this work!



There are no downloadables with this blog post, however, you should visit my resource library for other ideas on what to craft.
