
# Free Pattern from Loveknitting.com Twilleys of Stamford





**Bow Detail Felted bag** 

Height (excluding straps) approx.

Width approx.

25 cms 33 cms 10 ins 13 ins

Note: As felting is an inexact science it is not possible to give an exact finished measurement.

Twilleys Freedom Wool 50gm Balls

Main 5

Contrast 1

Pair of 7mm (UK 2 - USA 10½) knitting needles. Two double pointed 7mm (UK 2 - USA 10½) knitting needles.

# TENSION (Before Washing) - 13 sts and 18 rows to 10cm (4 in) over st st.

Unless the yarn specified is used, we cannot accept any responsibility for the finished work. It is advisable to purchase, at one time, the number of balls sufficient for your requirements.

Repeating this row forms an i-cord. Cont straight until the i-cord measures 61cm (24 in).

Break off yarn and thread through sts, Fill a bowl with hot water and a small pull up tightly and secure end.

# **ABBREVIATIONS**

cont - continue; dec - decreas(e) (ing); **foll** – following; **in** – inch(es); inc - increas(e)(ing); K - knit; mm - millimetres; P - purl; rem remain(ing); rep - repeat; rs - right side; **st(s)** – stitch(es); **tog** - together.

# **Centre Cord**

With 7mm double pointed needles and Contrast cast on 4 sts. Work an 81cm (32 in) i-cord. Break off yarn and thread through sts, this happening. This may take a few pull up tightly and secure end.

# BAG (Make 2)

With 7mm knitting needles and Main on 12 sts. cast on 50 sts. Working in st st beg K, work 44 rows. Eyelet row: (rs) K6, \*[K2, turn, P2, turn] 3 times, K2, K10 \* rep from \* to \* to last 8 sts, [K2, With 7mm needles and Contrast cast turn, P2, turn] 3 times, K2, K6. Next row: P. Cont in st st for 12 more rows. Cast off.

#### **Bow**

With 7mm needles and Contrast cast Beg K work 44 rows in st st. Cast off.

# **Bow Centre**

on 6 sts. Beg K work 18 rows in st st.

Cast off.

# Handles (Make 2)

With 7mm double pointed needles and Main cast on 4 sts. Knit 1 row (Do not turn needle around for next row). **next row**: Slide the sts along the needle to the tip of the right hand end Place in a laundry bag and put into a (the working yarn is still at the lefthand side of work). Bring the working 60 degree cycle using only a small yarn across the back of the stitches and knit the first stitch, pulling the yarn quite tightly. Knit the other3 stitches.

## **Felting**

Stitch together sides and base of bag. Using the photograph as a guide stitch the handles in position. Weave a piece of smooth, thick string and stitch in place. Gather up the once or twice around the loops created on the eyelet row. washing machine on a Quick Wash amount of detergent. When cycle has finished take out bag and remove the string. Pull bag into shape and leave to dry flat.

The centre cord, bow and bow centre are hand felted so you have more control over the finished size. amount of detergent. To help protect your hands we suggest you wear rubber gloves. Place pieces into the water and leave to soak for a few minutes. Rub the pieces until they start to thicken up, you will feel minutes so it is OK to stop for a while and come back to them. When the bow section measures around 9 x  $20cm (3\frac{1}{2} \times 8 ins)$  take it out of the water, rinse thoroughly in cold water and leave to dry flat. Repeat this process until the centre cord measures 56cm (22 ins) and the bow centre is 4 x 10cm (1½ x 4 ins).

## Making Up

Refer to the colour photograph as a guide.

Thread the i-cord through the eyelet holes and tack into place at the centre of the front.

Turn the cast on and cast off ends of the bow over by approx. 2.5cm (1 in) bow at the middle and wrap the centre piece around the bow. Stitch in place. Finally stitch the bow onto the front of the bag.
